## UO student groups to launch street safety initiatives along Patterson Street

**WHEN:** Wednesday, May 27, 1:30–3:00 pm

**WHERE:** Patterson Street between East 19th & East 23rd Avenues, Eugene

**WHO:** [Associated Students of The University of Oregon \(ASUO\)](#) empowers students to become future community leaders by providing experiential opportunities in governance, self-advocacy, and leadership within student organizations. They envision a campus culture that encourages and enables students to actively participate in and shape the institution.

[Graduate Teaching Fellows Federation \(GTFF\)](#) is a labor union representing over 1,500 graduate teaching fellows and research assistants at the University of Oregon. They are local 3544 of the American Federation of Teachers (AFT).

[LiveMove](#) is the University of Oregon transportation and livability student group, bringing together undergraduate and graduate students from a variety of backgrounds and disciplines to focus on the planning and design of transportation systems as they relate to community quality of life and livability.

**WHAT:** **Safe Streets Campaign:** ASUO and GTFF will install 20 signs to encourage safe driving near off-campus student housing.

**Quick Build Design:** LiveMove will unveil a proposed redesign of Patterson Street that can be installed this summer using inexpensive materials in advance of a more permanent solution.

**WHY:** In response to a wave of recent traffic fatalities, groups on and off campus are coming together for safe and welcoming transportation options for people from all walks of life.
